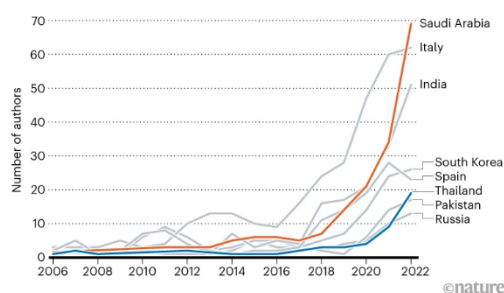
Reading 1

Up to four times more researchers pump out more than 60 papers a year than less than a decade ago. Saudi Arabia and Thailand saw the sharpest uptick in the number of such scientists over the past few years, according to a preprint posted on bioRxiv on 24 November. The increase in these ‘extremely productive’ authors raises concerns that some researchers are resorting to dubious methods to publish extra papers.

“I suspect that questionable research practices and fraud may underlie some of the most extreme behaviours,” says study co-author John Ioannidis, a physician specializing in metascience at Stanford University in California. “Our data provide a starting point for discussing these issues across all science.”

EXTREME GROWTH

Saudi Arabia had the highest number of extremely productive authors among the fastest-growing countries. However, Thailand had the sharpest increase between 2016 and 2022.



Ioannidis and his colleagues examined articles, reviews and conference papers indexed in the Scopus database between 2000 and 2022. They excluded physics authors, who tend to publish large numbers of papers because authorship practices in this field differ from those of other subjects. The researchers tracked how extremely productive authorship has changed over time in various countries and fields.

Overall, most extremely productive authors outside of physics were in clinical medicine, which had nearly 700 of these supercharged researchers in 2022 (see ‘Hyper-productive fields’). Agriculture, fisheries and forestry saw the speediest growth in extremely productive researchers, increasing by 14 times between 2016 and 2022, followed by biology and mathematics and statistics.

In 2022 alone, 1,266 non-physics authors published the equivalent of one paper every 5 days, including weekends, compared with 387 in 2016. The accelerated growth since 2016 was surprising, says Ioannidis, because an earlier analysis showed that extreme productivity was beginning to plateau in 2014. “There has been a very fast increase,” he says.

Outside physics, most countries more than doubled the number of extremely productive authors between 2016 and 2022, although some nations saw even bigger leaps (see ‘Extreme growth’). Thailand jumped from 1 extremely productive author in 2016 to 19 in 2022, the largest relative increase of all countries. However, Saudi Arabia saw the biggest growth in absolute terms, rising from 6 to 69 extremely productive authors over the same period.

Thailand has only a handful of authors who churn out huge volumes of papers each year, but the sudden increase in extreme productivity is concerning, says Tirayut Vilaivan, a member of the Office of Academic and Research Integrity at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok, which develops research policies and standards. “We cannot ignore that,” he says.

The uptick could be driven at least in part by the country’s research-funding system, which has switched to favouring large interdisciplinary teams instead of small groups, making it easier for researchers to get their names on more papers, says David Harding, a chemist at Suranaree University of Technology in Nakhon Ratchasima, Thailand. “Thailand has undergone a radical overhaul of its research ecosystem in an attempt to improve productivity,” says Harding.

Another contributing factor might be Thailand's focus on university rankings, which are underpinned by publication numbers and metrics, says Vilaivan. He adds that many universities in the country use cash **incentives** to encourage researchers to publish in prominent journals. If researchers play their cards right, they can earn up to 1 million Baht (US\$28,000) a year through publications alone, he says.

Amid global conflicts and endless sources of stress, Pantone's color of the year for 2024 is PANTONE 13-1023 Peach Fuzz, a gentle and nurturing peach shade that serves as a reminder to slow down and care for ourselves and one another. The romantic color's name

reflects the tactile sensuality associated with the hue: velvety peaches, soft marabou feathers, and smooth vintage satins and silks all come to mind when thinking about the pink and orange combo.

For Leatrice Eiseman, the Executive Director of the Pantone Color Institute, Peach Fuzz is a fitting color for the moment we're living in, a reflection of the basic human needs and desires many may be feeling in the midst of challenging times.

"As we enter 2024, some of the things that have become especially apparent to us is the concept of lifestyle taking on new meaning," Eiseman told TIME. "We've been

living in this time of turmoil in many aspects of our lives, and as a result of that, our need for nurturing, empathy, and compassion continues to grow stronger as we imagine a more peaceful future."

Eiseman points out that the delicate shade summons viewers to the human experience, with an emphasis on the importance of health and wellness for mind, body, and soul. From the warm colors of a sunrise or sunset to the coziness of a fuzzy blanket, the color affirms moments of internal tranquility with the deep need for community, gathering, and connection.

"We've been reminded that a vital part of living a good life and a full life is having the good health and the stamina and the strength to enjoy it," Eiseman said. "In a world which often emphasizes productivity and external achievement, it's important we recognize the need to foster our inner selves and find moments of respite, creativity, and human connection."

For Laurie Pressman, Vice President of the Pantone Color Institute, this year's color selection is especially significant, given that it's the 25th anniversary of the Pantone Color of the Year program. To Pressman, the curation of a color that is synonymous with human connection is symbolic of not only this year, but the overall goal of the program itself.

"With this year's Pantone Color of the Year 2024, we see an increased focus on community and people across the world reframing how they want to live and evaluating what is important—that being the comfort of being close to those we love," Pressman said in a statement. "The color is one whose warm and welcoming embrace conveys a message of compassion and whose cozy sensibility brings people together and enriches the soul. In the spirit of PANTONE 13-1023 Peach Fuzz, we reflect back on the last 25 years of the Pantone Color of the Year program, grateful to provide an avenue where designers and color enthusiasts all over the world can engage in a conversation about color, be inspired by color and showcase their creativity within their communities."

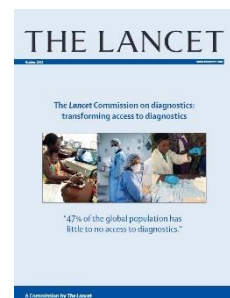
In the right circumstances, caesarean birth can substantially reduce maternal and perinatal morbidity and mortality, key targets of Sustainable Development Goal 3.1. However, caesarean rates vary from 5% in sub-Saharan

Africa to 24% in western Europe and 43% in Latin America, indicating that non-medical factors influence provision and uptake. WHO has previously advised that

population-level caesarean section rates exceeding 10–15% are not associated with reductions in maternal and newborn mortality rates.

In countries such as Sierra Leone, increasing access to medically indicated caesarean birth in well-resourced health-care facilities might contribute to reductions in maternal and perinatal mortality; maternal mortality rates have recently declined substantially from 717 deaths per 100 000 livebirths to 443 deaths per 100 000 livebirths. However, in countries such as Brazil, the high caesarean birth rate (currently 56%) raises concerns about associated direct maternal mortality. Major complications and deaths can result from surgical caesarean deliveries, particularly where resource-constrained facilities or access to an adequately trained workforce might limit the capacity for safe surgery and perioperative care. This increased caesarean rate extends beyond private health-care systems to public teaching hospitals and is driven by factors such as women's fear of childbirth, health-care professionals' litigation concerns, and health-system-related factors.
