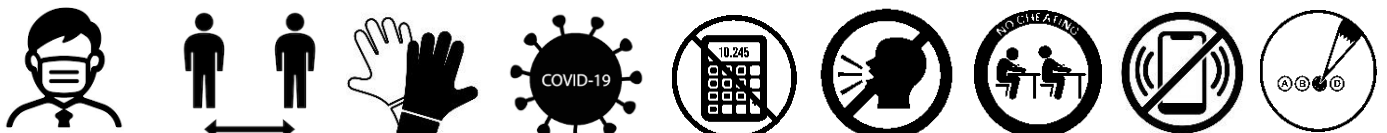

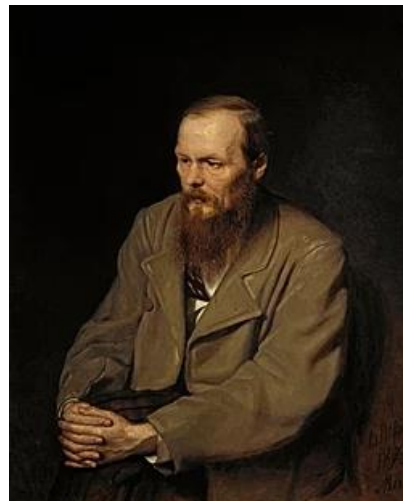

Reading 1

Fyodor Mikhailovich Dostoevsky was a Russian philosopher, novelist, short story writer, essayist and journalist. He is regarded as one of the greatest novelists in both Russian and world literature, and many of his works are considered highly influential masterpieces. Dostoevsky's literary works explore the human condition in the troubled political, social and spiritual atmospheres of 19th-century Russia, and engage with a variety of philosophical and religious themes. His most **acclaimed** novels include *Crime and Punishment* (1866), *The Idiot* (1869), *Demons* (1872), *The Adolescent* (1875) and *The Brothers Karamazov* (1880). His *Notes from Underground*, a novella published in 1864, is considered one of the first works of existentialist literature.



Born in Moscow in 1821, Dostoevsky was introduced to literature at an early age through fairy tales and legends and through books by Russian and foreign authors. His mother died in 1837, and around the same time, he left school to enter the Nikolayev Military Engineering Institute (later renamed the Military Engineering-Technical University). After graduating, he worked as an engineer and briefly enjoyed a lavish lifestyle, translating books to earn extra money. In the mid-1840s, he wrote his first novel, *Poor Folk*, which gained him entry into Saint Petersburg's literary circles. However, he was arrested in 1849 for belonging to a literary group, the Petrashevsky Circle, that discussed banned books critical of Tsarist Russia. Dostoevsky was sentenced to death, but the sentence was commuted at the last moment. He spent four years in a Siberian prison camp, followed by six years of compulsory military service in exile. In the following years, Dostoevsky worked as a journalist, publishing and editing several magazines of his own and later *A Writer's Diary*, a collection of his writings. He began to travel around Western Europe and developed a gambling addiction, which led to financial hardship. For a time, he had to beg for money, but he eventually became one of the most widely read and highly regarded Russian writers.

Dostoevsky's body of work consists of thirteen novels, three novellas, seventeen short stories, and numerous other works. His writings were widely read both within and beyond his native Russia, influencing an equally great number of later writers, including Russians such as Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn and Anton Chekhov, the philosophers Albert Camus and Jean-Paul Sartre, and the emergence of Existentialism and Freudianism. Friedrich Nietzsche called him "the only psychologist from whom I (Nietzsche) had something to learn" in Twilight of the Idols, one of his final works before suffering a mental collapse. His books have been translated into more than 170 languages, and served as the inspiration for many films.

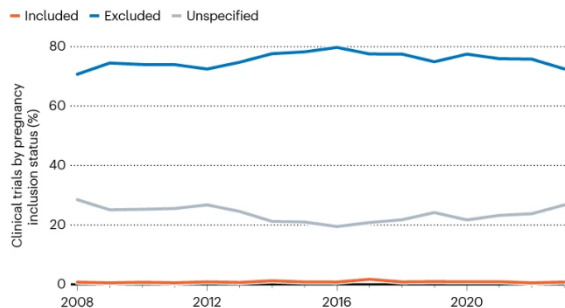

Reading 2



In 2021, amid the COVID-19 pandemic, Kristin Wall became pregnant with her second child. Her physician told her that little was known about the COVID-19 vaccine's safety and effectiveness in pregnant people. Observational data — collected from those

vaccinated before they knew that they were pregnant — suggested that the vaccine was safe, so she could have it. Still, she'd have to weigh up the risks and benefits herself.

Wall is an epidemiologist at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, and is therefore unusually qualified to assess health risks. But her experience is a common one — and far from unique to COVID-19. When it comes to pregnancy, people must often make important medical decisions with limited or imperfect information, says Wall. Pregnancy changes the body, including how it metabolizes and distributes medications, so a drug with a predictable effect in a non-pregnant person might work very differently in someone who is pregnant.

There is now solid evidence from the huge numbers of people vaccinated, and subsequent clinical trials, that the COVID-19 vaccines that use messenger RNA (mRNA) — as well as influenza vaccines and others that do not use live viruses — are generally safe and effective during pregnancy. Safety is also well established for certain other medications: some anti-allergy drugs, some antidepressants and some antibiotics are considered safe for use in pregnancy. Paracetamol (acetaminophen) — the main ingredient in Tylenol — is also considered safe, despite claims to the contrary by US President Donald Trump. Other drugs, however, are known to carry risks. An example is the anti-epilepsy drug sodium valproate, which can cause severe developmental disorders when taken during pregnancy.

Most people take medications during pregnancy — more than 90% in the United States according to some tallies¹. Despite this, the safety and effectiveness of many drugs — including some anti-nausea treatments, some anti-inflammatories and the vast majority of medicines approved over the past decade — remain uncertain because they have never been tested in pregnant people. Fears over adverse consequences and associated policy restrictions mean that pregnant people have been largely excluded from clinical trials. That leaves public-health officials and health-care providers basing recommendations on indirect evidence,

including animal studies, trials in non-pregnant people and observational studies of pregnant people taking a drug after it is already on the market.

“The gap is huge,” says Wall. She and others have designed trials that have successfully tested treatments for Ebola, HIV and some pregnancy-specific conditions in pregnant people — collecting reliable data while protecting the health of study participants and their babies. Based on that experience, they have developed tools and guidance to help other researchers to include pregnant people in studies, too. But despite these advances, logistical, regulatory and ethical barriers remain.

Reading 3

The next-generation spacesuit for NASA’s Artemis III mission continues to advance by passing a contractor-led technical review, as the agency prepares to send humans to the Moon’s South Pole for the first time. Testing is also underway for the new suits, built by Axiom Space, with NASA astronauts and spacesuit engineers recently simulating surface operations and tasks underwater to demonstrate safety and mobility.



The AxEMU (Axiom Extravehicular Mobility Unit), is designed to give astronauts increased flexibility and improved mobility for moonwalking, including bending down to collect geology samples and perform a variety of scientific tasks. The suit features increased sizing options and adjustability to fit a wider range of crew members. It incorporates advanced life-support systems and enhanced protection to withstand the harsh lunar environment. Axiom Space is also developing specialized tools and equipment for work on the lunar surface, allowing astronauts to more easily gather geology samples.

Now that Axiom Space has completed their technical review of the AxEMU, NASA will evaluate whether the spacesuit is ready for the agency's Artemis III mission that will return American astronauts to the Moon. A NASA-led critical design sync review, which is an agency-required technical evaluation, will confirm that the design's hardware and systems are on track for final testing and delivery. In parallel, Axiom Space has begun receiving parts for the first flight unit, which will be assembled later this spring.

"The completion of their internal review brings Axiom Space one step closer to delivering a next-generation lunar spacesuit," said Lara Kearney, manager of the Extravehicular Activity and Human Surface Mobility Program at Johnson Space Center in Houston. "This achievement reflects our shared commitment to deliver a safe, capable lunar spacesuit that will enable astronauts to explore the Moon's surface."

NASA and Axiom Space have conducted over 850 hours of pressurized testing with a person inside the AxEMU. Leading up to the review, teams conducted underwater and simulated **lunar gravity** tests of the AxEMU in facilities at NASA Johnson that demonstrate how the spacesuit's capabilities will offer increased mobility as astronauts explore the Moon's surface and prepare for missions to Mars. These tests allow astronauts and engineers to become familiar with the spacesuit and practice moving and performing tasks in a simulated lunar gravity environment, which is one-sixth the gravity we experience on Earth. Suit users have provided feedback on design, functionality, and safety.
